Eligibility

- Open to current undergraduate students or to students who graduated no earlier than Summer 2024.
- Research must have been conducted primarily while enrolled as an undergraduate.
- Group submissions are welcome; however, the presenting author must be an undergraduate student.

Abstract Guidelines

- Length: Maximum of 500 words
- Format:
 - o Title (maximum 20 words),
 - Author(s) and affiliation(s),
 - Background and purpose of the study,
 - Methods/approach,
 - Key results or findings (may be preliminary)
 - Significance and relevance to the field,
- Restrictions
 - No figures or tables in the abstract
 - Use clear, concise, and professional language.

- Abstract submission deadline: November 17, 2025
- Notification of acceptance: December 15, 2025
- Poster presentation date: March 19

Prepare your abstract using the provided template. Once complete, convert it to a PDF and name the file using the following format: Lastname_Firstname_2026CRC_UGRPoster.PDF.
