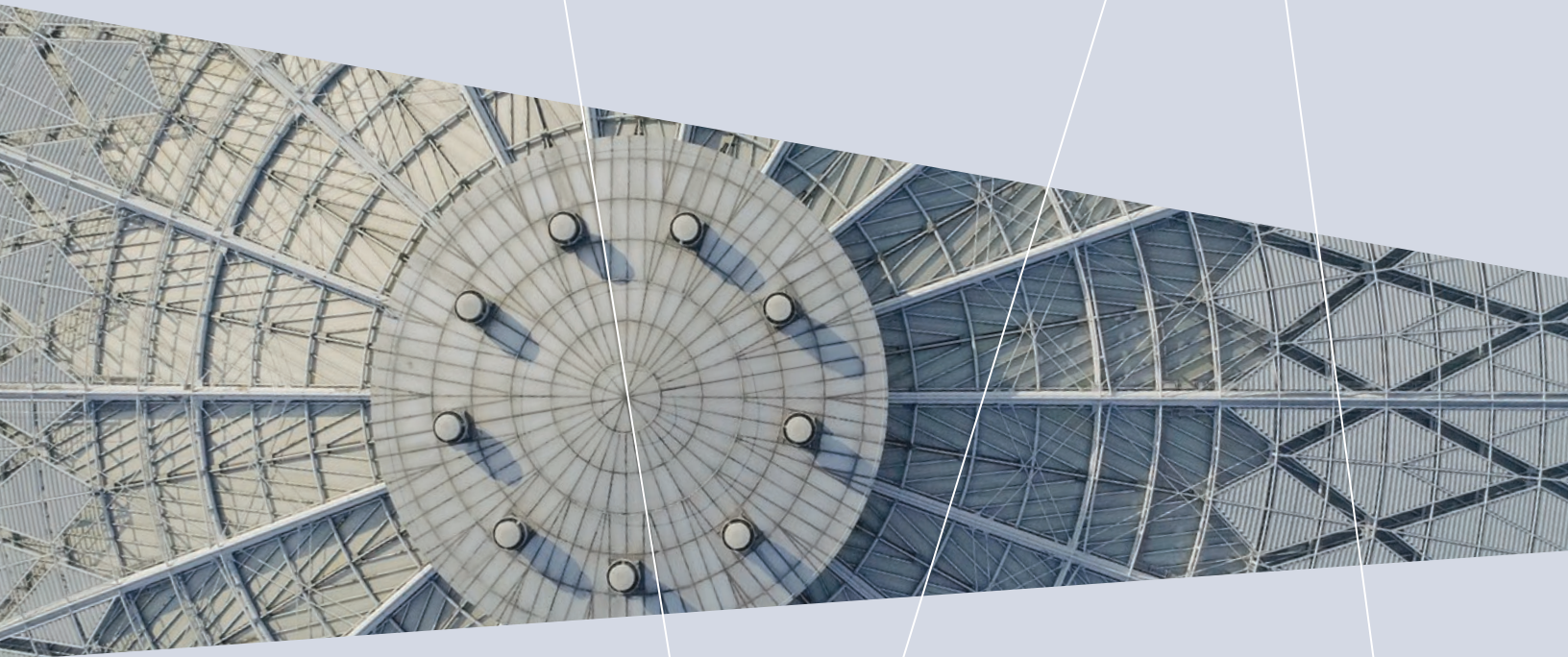

IMMEDIATE OUTCOMES (1-2 YEARS)

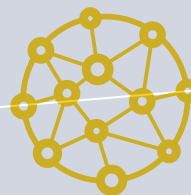

Together, we believe that ASCE members will engineer a better tomorrow.

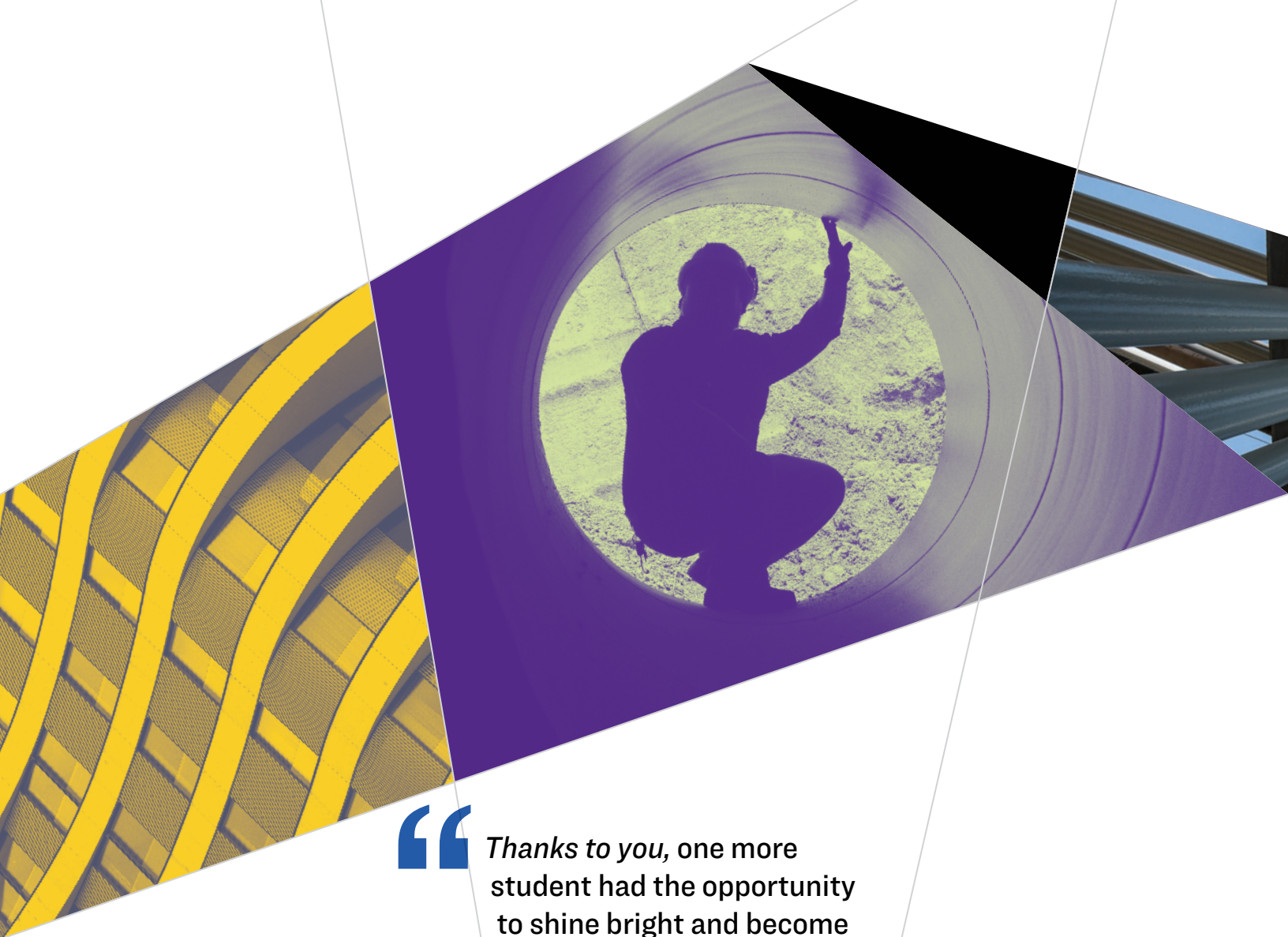
